







Light Rail: -8% YoY


Heavy Rail: +10% YoY



Why is Testimony Important?





Good testimony can move lawmakers to vote yes on critical bills and support GDT amendments Testimony from GDT members legitimizes GDT, making it easier for us to work behind the scenes

Witnesses from GDT can answer questions from lawmakers, helping to educate them and make them more likely to support transit in the future

Ahead of the Hearing



- 1. Listen for GDT hearing notices and action alerts!
- 2. Figure out which bill you are interested in/what your scheduling availability is
- 3. Write your testimony
- 4. Sign up on the GA website
 - a. In person, remote, or written testimony accepted
- 5. DM June so she can keep track of our witness list and topics covered



What to Expect



Each bill being heard has these phases:

- 1. Bill introduction (5-20 minutes)
- 2. Public testimony (Variable)
- 3. Amendments (0-15 minutes)
- Final Comments and Vote (10-15 minutes

Testimony is 3 minutes each, but can be limited to 2

Hearings take a long time

Committee members may ask questions to witnesses, they usually only ask questions to expert witnesses

Witness orders may be predetermined or may be random. Usually we do not know when you will testify!

What to Include In Your Testimony



Begin with thanking the chair and members of the committee.
Introduce yourself:

- Name, where you live, that you're with GDT, and any other information you want the committee to know
- Name the bill and share your position on it: (Support, Oppose, Amend)

Tell the committee why you have a stake in the bill. Explain your position on it and why.

- How does this bill affect you?
 - Share a personal story
- For professionals with relevant experience, share your expertise

End your testimony by restating your position and ask the lawmakers to take action

Senate Bill: 24-184 Detail






- 1. Generate \$50M/yr of funding for transit by imposing a ~\$3 fee on car rentals
- 2. Authorizes potential funding for FRPR from RTD's FasTracks savings account (\$150M-\$300M)
 - a. RTD's NW Rail Corridor is expanded beyond the RTD District to Fort Collins
 - b. This will allow the project to qualify for Federal intercity rail funds (matches to the car rental funding)
 - c. Separately, we have assurances from FRPR District Leadership that the ballot measure that goes to voters will still be for a Pueblo to Fort Collins service via Denver Union Station
- 3. Lays the groundwork for an intro FRPR rail service (could be considered a demo service) from Denver Union Station to Fort Collins
 - a. Likely to have fewer stops than RTD's planned B Line would have
 - b. Bill mentions/contemplates rail to Craig/Steamboat and future long-distance service from recent Federal studies (without additional funding mentioned) south to Pueblo and Trinidad to Albuquerque and Dallas/Houston more aspirations than anything else at this time
- 4. Requires a report to be issued which contains an implementation plan for NW Rail starter service of either 3 or 5 round trips to Fort Collins by 2028
- 5. Will explore the possibility of consolidating all heavy rail in Colorado under one Colorado Rail Authority

How can we support this first step,

AND advocate for a Fast, Frequent, Reliable, and Accessible FRPR ballot measure?
