WHERE

Intercity passenger rail service will connect travelers across Colorado's Front Range with stations in Fort Collins, Loveland, Longmont, Bouder, Denver, South Metro, Castle Rock, Colorado Springs and Pueblo.



WHY

From 2020 to 2050, an additional 3 million people are expected to live and commute along Colorado's Front Range. Front Range Passenger Rail will provide a relaxed, efficient, and safe transportation option that provides increased accessibility to housing, workforce, employment opportunities and key destinations.



WHEN

Front Range Passenger Rail District (the District) is modeling service frequency, infrastructure, operation costs and financing needs. Daily passenger rail service is expected to launch within the decade.



HOW

The Colorado Legislature created the District to construct and operate a passenger rail system along the Front Range. Using existing tracks expedites the service start date. New passenger rail programs and expanded federal funding create a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to bring passenger rail to Colorado's Front Range.



The District extends from the Wyoming to New Mexico borders, spanning portions or the entirety of the 13 counties near Interstate 25 in Colorado. The nine stations will connect to other public transit services to provide an accessible transportation option.
