





Feb 14th - Light Rail Slow Zones







HB25-1007 Paratransit Services



Requires paratransit providers to:

- Establish, in coordination with local public entities providing emergency services, a plan to communicate information and provide paratransit services during emergencies
- Ensure that fare collection technology for paratransit services is comparable to that offered for regular or fixed route services
- Before reducing the service area for paratransit services, to consult with affected community members and conduct an impact analysis

Creates a 16 member paratransit task force in CDOT.

The purpose of the task force is to study and make recommendations regarding the standardization of and best practices for paratransit services in the state.

HB25-1044 Vulnerable Road User Protection



Authorizes a county, city and county, municipality or a TABOR exempt enterprise to generate additional fee-based funding for local transportation system strategies that improve safety for vulnerable road users.

- Additional local motor vehicle registration fees
- Fees based on the weight of a passenger car or light truck, and fuel-efficiency
- Fee revenue to be expended only for vulnerable road user protection strategies, which include infrastructure projects, including active transportation network projects and local transit improvements and enhancements
- Authorizes and encourages local governments to consider equity to meet the needs of all community members through the provision of equitable levels of access to affordable and reliable transportation options
- Fees collected by CO Dept. of Revenue and distributed to local government




SB25-030 Transportation Mode Choice



Requires CDOT to

- Present a statewide mode choice assessment to the TLRC, the transportation commission, and the Colorado energy office, including recommendations for targets for 2030, 2035, 2040, 2045, and 2050 for the department, MPOs, and large transit providers for the share of total trip within a specified geographic area completed using certain modes
- Adopt rules establishing mode choice targets and reassess the mode choice targets before each statewide plan development cycle
- Every 3 years thereafter, in coordination with the MPOs, present a report to the TLRC that provides information about the mode choice targets and plans to implement
- Every 5 years thereafter, with the MPOs, large transit providers, and local governments with a population of 25,000+ individuals prepare a mode choice implementation plan, with information about the mode choice targets



SB25-051 RTD Operating Costs





Changes the definition of RTD's "operating costs" to mean all operating expenditures, excluding depreciation.

Previously excluding costs incurred in long-term planning and development of mass transportation and rapid transit infrastructures and the costs incurred as a result of providing transportation services mandated by the federal "Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 will now be included in the definition of "operating costs".

SB25-052 Railroad Report Confidentiality





SB25-161 Transit (RTD) Reform



Requires RTD to:

- Align with statewide greenhouse gas reduction targets
- Create worker retention goals
- Adhere to new FTA requirements regarding assaults
- Create a 10 year strategic plan
- Do a comprehensive operational analysis every 5 years
- Publish information related to capital projects, ridership & service, service changes, workforce, and safety
- Update its service policies and standards
- Add 2x ex-officio members to the Board

Creates a 2nd accountability committee to build on the 2021 committee's work that will make recommendations on the governance structure and compensation of the RTD board and executive leadership, representation of local governments and state agencies, and RTD's workforce.
